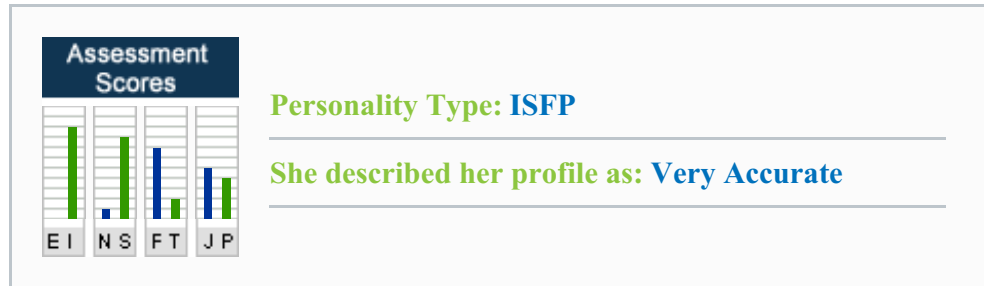

Introduction

Of the many factors that contribute to a successful education and subsequent career, an understanding of personality type is among the most useful.

While interests and skills change during the course of a person's life, the one thing that does remain constant is an individual's personality type — the innate way in which each person naturally prefers to see the world and make decisions.
